Policy Statement:

At Buckswood School, we believe that a uniform dress code fosters a sense of community, equality, and school pride. To promote a focused and respectful learning environment, all students are required to wear the official school uniform daily.

This policy applies to all school students at Buckswood School.

1. Uniform Requirements:

- All students must wear the official school uniform as prescribed by the school.
- The uniform must be clean, well-maintained, and properly fitted.
- Boys: white shirt/ white polo, school tie, dark blue trousers/shorts, school jacket/school blazer.
- Girls: white shirt/ white polo, school dress/ shirt, dark blue trousers/shorts, school cardigans/school blazer.
- Seasonal items such as sweaters, blazers, or summer uniforms must also adhere to school guidelines.

2. Footwear:

- Students are required to wear black, polished shoes that are appropriate for school activities.
- Shoes must be kept clean and polished regularly.
- Athletic shoes may be permitted for physical education classes but must be changed back to regular school shoes immediately afterward.

3. Accessories:

- Minimal and modest accessories are allowed. Jewelry should be limited to stud earrings and a simple wristwatch.
- Hair must be neat and tidy. Long hair should be tied back.
- No makeup, nail polish, or non-uniform items are permitted.

4. Physical Education (PE) Uniform:

- Students must wear the designated PE uniform on days when they have physical education classes and non-academic trips. This includes PE uniform details: a school-branded T-shirt, shorts or tracksuit, and appropriate athletic shoes.

5. Compliance:

- Wearing the school uniform and polished shoes is mandatory for all students.
- Parents are responsible for ensuring that their child comes to school dressed according to the uniform policy.
- Non-compliance with the uniform policy will result in [outline consequences, e.g., a note home, detention, or a meeting with parents].

6. Exceptions:

- Any exceptions to the uniform policy, such as for medical or religious reasons, must be approved by the school administration in advance.
- On special non-uniform days, students will be notified of the dress code and any restrictions in place.

Communication to Parents:

- The uniform policy will be communicated to parents at the start of the academic year and reminders will be issued as needed.
- Parents are encouraged to support the school by ensuring their child adheres to this policy daily.
